

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

As we approach the end of 2022, it is worth remembering that throughout this year a variety of rostering home measures have been required as we continued to deal with the effects of Covid-19 in our community. Once again, staff and students have had to adapt their teaching and learning which makes the achievements we have seen across the school this year even more impressive.

Student Success

Those family members who attended the recent honours ceremonies will have seen that Howick College students have won individual tertiary scholarships worth well over \$400,000. Furthermore, several teams were also successful at a very high level, including the students who won the national EVolocity electric vehicle competition, the Samsung Solve for Tomorrow competition and the Auckland ESports competition. Howick College has once again been recognised as a school that supports our students to be curious, creative and innovative, which are fundamental to the curriculum we deliver.

Education Outside the Classroom

Developing students' capabilities such as resilience, problem solving and collaboration are at the heart of learning programmes at Howick College. Some of our most popular outdoor education courses and activities which explicitly develop these capabilities have been postponed over the last two years. Therefore, it has been particularly heartening to see our EOTC activities resume and our students complete tramps at Waikaremoana, surfing at Omaha Beach and Year 9 camps at Waharau. Similarly, back at the college it has been a privilege to welcome audiences back into the theatre to enjoy a variety of performances and exhibitions.

Property Update

Across the school, we continue to develop the physical spaces in order to support students in their learning. We currently have a number of major projects moving into the construction phase, including: the development of 13 new flexible learning spaces in G and L block, a new learning hub to replace the old library, and the completion of the Sommerville Special School satellite building. We continue to meet weekly with the project managers and we hope to see all of these projects realised early in 2023.

Over 105 schools from around New Zealand recently competed in the EVolocity regional finals. The teams were equipped with an electric bike componentry kit and, guided by their teachers and mentors, built and designed their own electric vehicles.

This year our team of enthusiastic Y11 students, AKA The Loyal Engineers, built a 4 wheeled 1K electric cart with fly-by wire steering and brakes, audio, crash avoidance systems and a CVT gearbox. The students used the Howick College workshop to machine their own wheel hubs, axles, chassis, hydraulic brake components and to weld their chassis together. In addition, they designed and made their own computer control and electronic systems.


Y9 2023 Transition Day

Three years ago, Southern Cross Partners Loans and Investments presented their inaugural Tertiary Scholarship (valued at up to \$72,000 over four years) to a Year 13 student. Since then, founding directors Barry and Julia Milward along with managing partner, Cam Harper, have changed the lives of six more Howick College students and their families for the better.

The local business firmly believes in the benefits of supporting its community and with this in mind they have worked alongside the college to assist talented students whose circumstances meant pursuing tertiary study could be a challenge. However, with so many outstanding applicants to choose from, the local business decided to award a further one-off financial contribution of \$5,000 each year.

This substantial scholarship has been life changing, enabling past recipients Jenna Hainsworth (Conjoint Bachelor's Degree in Business and International Hospitality) and Tim Schoeman (Bachelor of Engineering) to focus on their studies without the added worry of having to support themselves. This year's recipient, Erika Sawyers, still can't believe it's real. Erika, whose family moved into zone to enable her to attend Howick College, intends to study a Conjoint Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Commerce Degree at the University of Auckland next year.

The Southern Cross Partners team was delighted to have the opportunity to meet with past and present scholarship recipients at a morning tea recently hosted by the Community Development Office. Also present were financial contribution recipients, Chris Camm (Bachelor of Accounting), Sam Vaea (Bachelor of Medical Science) and Sophie Zaadstra, who intends to study a conjoint bachelor's degree in the Arts and Global Studies.

Mr Harper says they have found their relationship with the college to be extremely rewarding and encourages other businesses to invest in our collective future by partnering with Howick College. Mr Harper added that he is very happy to have a conversation about the numerous benefits with anyone contemplating doing this.
