

To all the people who have been part of my journey – I extend my personal thanks and gratitude. I pay tribute to every member of the Senior Leadership Team (past and present) for their friendship and their professional expertise that has helped to shape our school's future. I also acknowledge the many Board members and our wider community for their relentless support of our staff and students. I have learnt much and enjoyed your company and I leave here all the richer for the experience. I am extremely grateful to have paddled alongside you all in the Howick College waka, the memories will be cherished. May each and every one of you enjoy a full and happy life and continue to live and exemplify the school values of courtesy, commitment, curiosity and courage. I wish you and the college well.

Innovative Students "WOW" Judges at Samsung Solve For Tomorrow Competition

Earlier this year, our Y9 Creative Design students entered Samsung's nationwide **Solve for Tomorrow** competition. Organised in partnership with MOTAT, the competition challenged students to use design-thinking and STEAM to identify an issue in their local community and come up with an idea or product as a solution, providing a great opportunity for our students to apply themselves to real world problems. One group chose diabetes as their focus and developed a less invasive means for diabetics to calculate their blood glucose levels. Judges, including Dr Siouxsie Wiles, were extremely impressed by the work of **Eva Malez, Htet Waiyan, Kurt Marshall and Lennox Dilworth,** who were awarded **FIRST** prize (worth \$12,000) for their prototype device and app. The students will receive \$6000 cash and \$3000 worth of products to share. The school will also receive \$3000 worth of products from Samsung. Well done everyone!
